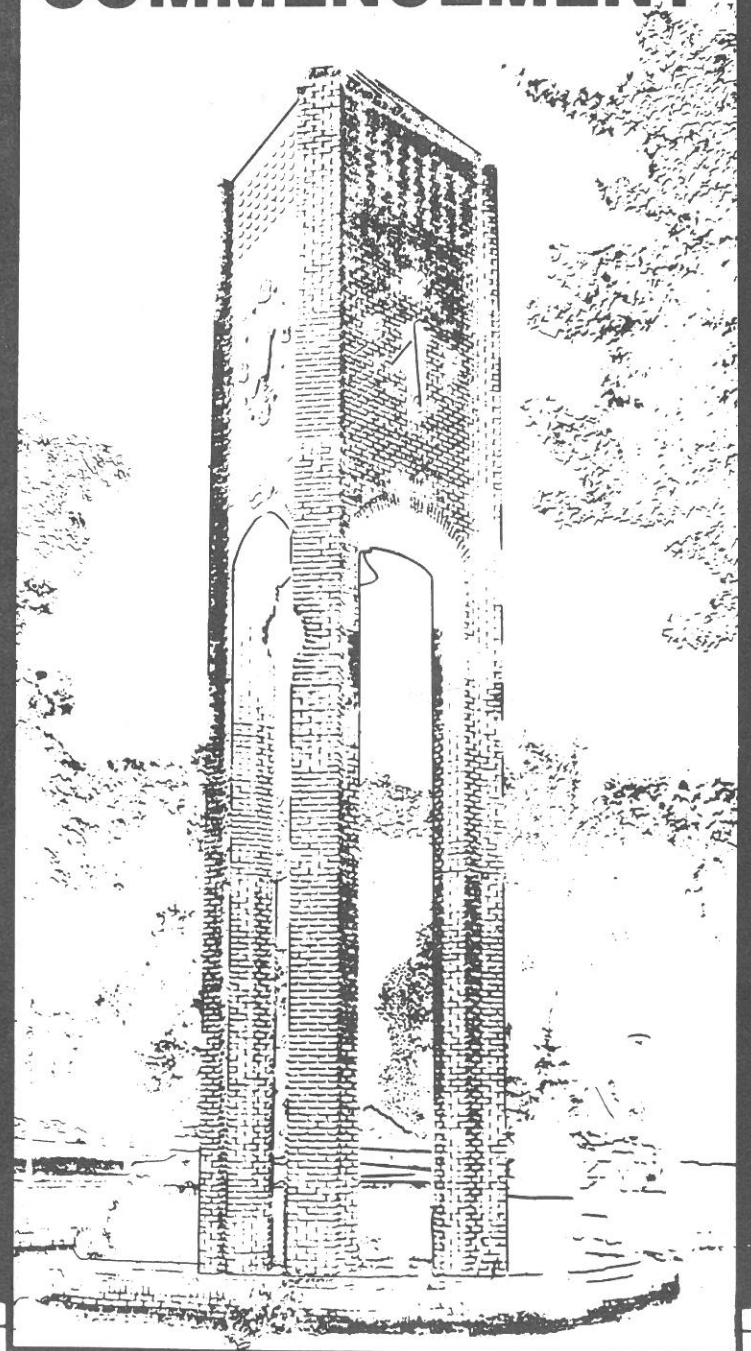

GRADUATION HONORS

Superior scholarship is recognized in the senior class by awarding Special Honors, the Gold "R" for Senior Academic Honors or Senior Honorable Mention. Those graduating with Special Honors have maintained a grade point average of at least 3.75 while completing their requirements. Students receiving the Senior Gold "R" have at least a 3.5 average and those receiving Senior Honorable Mention have at least a 3.25 average. They are designated in the program in the following manner:

ACADEMIC GARB

The cap and gown which faculty and students are wearing today have a tradition going back to the 12th and 13th centuries during the Middle Ages, when students and faculty were considered members of the clergy with special political and social privileges.

The Bachelor's gown has a closed front and long, pointed open sleeves. The Master's gown has an open front with extremely long closed sleeves, from which the arms protrude through a slit at the elbow; the end of the sleeve is square, with an arc of a circle just above the bottom. The Doctor's gown is an open-fronted garment with voluminous bell shaped sleeves on which appear three velvet bars (usually black, but sometimes blue for philosophy.) Gowns are usually black, although recently some universities have begun to use other colors (New York University - purple, University Chicago - maroon).

The academic hood is edged in colored velvet which indicates the field in which the degree was earned. The Master's velvet is about two inches wide; the Doctoral velvet is five or six inches wide. The doctoral colors are dark blue for the Ph.D. (Doctor of Philosophy), light blue for the Ed.D. (Doctor of Education) and light purple for Doctor of Laws.

For master's degrees, the color of the velvet band is:

The colors in the lining of the hood indicate the institution from which the degree was obtained, e.g. Indiana University is crimson and white, University of Minnesota is maroon and gold.
